Sonja Saunderson began her tenure as the EPPF's Chief Investment Officer (CIO) on 1 November 2022. She smiles when she explains that the first few days at the Fund have introduced her to an intimate yet bustling culture. "The EPPF is such a professionally run fund. It is revered and respected in the industry, so I'm excited to be a part of that," she says.

Leaving Momentum, where she worked for 22 years, was not an easy decision. In the modern working world, staying at a company for two decades isn't particularly common. In Sonja's case, it is indicative of her values. "When you're surrounded by the right people, and when your work positively impacts the lives of others, staying for 22 years comes naturally," she says.

Her work was rewarding and meaningful in that it became an extension of her passion for people. Regardless, life is full of opportunities to learn and grow. Despite her already impressive and extensive career history, Sonja continues to seek out ways to be impactful and leave a strong legacy. She is motivated by two simple words: What's next? This time around, the Eskom Pension and Provident Fund was the answer.

# YOUR FINANCES

## *a) Pension Increase and Bonus 2023*

### **Increase of 4% for all pensions from 1 January 2023**

The EPPF Board has approved an increase of 4% for all pensions from 1 January 2023:

- The increase will reflect in your 1 January 2023 pension.
- The increase will reflect in your December 2022 payslip.

People who began receiving pensions from 1 January 2022 will receive prorated increases (according to the number of months their pensions have been paid).

### **Pension bonus of R8 150,00 per household**

The EPPF Board has also approved a flat pension bonus of R8 150,00 per household:

- The bonus will be paid with your 1 December 2022 pension.
- The bonus will reflect in your November 2022 payslip.

People who began receiving pensions after 1 December 2021 will receive prorated bonuses (according to the number of months their pensions have been paid).

### **The increase and bonus are determined after the annual actuarial valuation**

The Fund does an annual actuarial valuation when the actuary compares the assets and liabilities of the Fund.

These valuations are necessary to assess the long-term sustainability of the EPPF as a defined benefit pension provider. Following the latest actuarial valuation, the EPPF Board approved an increase of 4% for all pensioners effective from 1 January 2023.

### **Pension increase balances inflation with Fund sustainability**

The long-term objective of the EPPF Board when considering pension increases is to assist pensioners. The EPPF aims to award increases that match the rate of inflation as measured by the Consumer Price Index (CPI). However, this must tie to the sustainability of the EPPF.

And at the beginning of this year, the EPPF carried out an inflation increase 'catch up' to adjust pensions for people who had received increases that were not in line with CPI over the past 20 years.

### **Caring for pensioners remains an EPPF priority**

The EPPF Board continues to find ways to support pensioners during these challenging financial times and the EPPF is in the process of a pension increase policy review. We're speaking to you during our member engagement sessions and will communicate the outcome once the process has been completed.

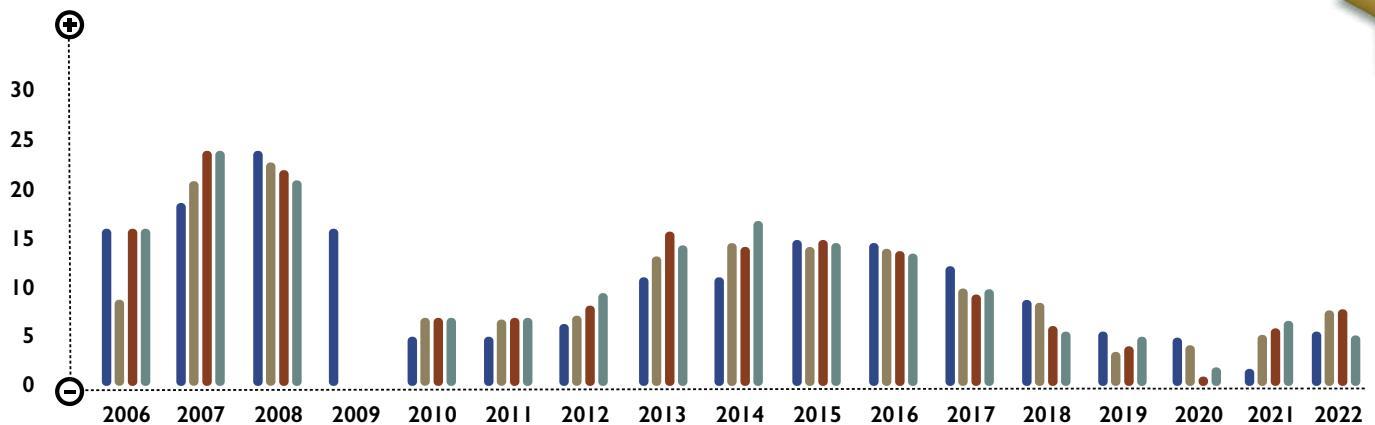

# A HEALTHIER YOU

*Loneliness: As Lethal  
as Smoking 15 Cigarettes  
a Day*

Both social isolation (physical separation from others), and loneliness (the perception of being alone) are bad for our health. And not just for our state of mind – they're also bad for our hearts. There's proof, says Dr Scott Lear in an article for Heart and Stroke, a Canadian organisation helping people live healthier lives.

"Despite how connected we think we are on social media, nearly half of adults feel lonely or left out and a quarter are socially isolated", says Lear, going on to point out that "With the pandemic and its restrictive lockdown measures, these numbers are likely to be much higher." Heart and Stroke explains that "Some researchers have even suggested being isolated or lonely is equivalent to smoking 15 cigarettes per day."

A couple of the studies that confirm the bad effects on our health:

A study published in JAMA Network sets the scene by explaining "In the US, cardiovascular disease (CVD) is the leading cause of death in women and accounts for approximately 1 in every 5 deaths among women." The researchers looked at "57 825 older women in the US" and found that "social isolation and loneliness were associated with an 8.0% and 5.0% higher risk for incident CVD, respectively". The numbers for those with "greater social isolation and greater loneliness" were higher: "13.0% to 27.0% higher risk of incident CVD".

"In a large population cohort of Danish adults followed for up to 7 years, social isolation was associated with an increased all-cause mortality", say the authors of a study in Nature, adding that "mortality was increased by 1.7 and 1.6-fold in men and women". Both studies mention that social isolation and loneliness are associated with or may influence smoking and physical inactivity. The JAMA Network study notes an association with CVD risk factors like increased blood pressure, higher cholesterol levels, obesity and poor diet.

The authors of the Nature study say, "Our findings indicate that the effect of social isolation on mortality

are similar to well-established risk factors such as alcohol consumption and obesity."

"Not having a spouse or a partner is an especially important risk factor", says the article in Nature, yet more and more people are living alone, say the authors.

How you can reduce loneliness

Lear suggests you:

Increase your social contacts: Reach out by phone or video chat if you can't meet in person. "Don't worry about having a reason; 'I just wanted to say hello' is as good as any".

Volunteer: "A review of 40 studies found that people who volunteered had a lower risk of early death", says Lear. "This social activity improves overall health and wellbeing. People who volunteer may have a lower risk for hypertension and also report better health".

Sing and listen to music: "Singing in a group or by yourself, and even just listening to music, can release oxytocin, the love hormone", says Lear, making you feel "connected with people".

The UK's Campaign to End Loneliness adds:

Invest time in new connections: "Joining local groups or classes based on your interests is one of the best ways of making new connections."

Little things like saying 'hello' make a difference: Whether you greet "a neighbour, your local shop keeper or a person at the bus stop ... brief exchanges with others can positively impact how you feel about yourself and can make you feel more receptive to other, possibly more meaningful, relationships".

Greeting people you encounter during your daily activities has been found by a study in the Personality and Social Psychology Bulletin to help you feel like you belong. So why not say hello to a stranger today?

And of course, if you have concerns about your mental or physical health, it's best to discuss them with your doctor.

# HOT TOPIC

## *Taking Care of Yourself During the Summer*

The festive season sees temperatures skyrocket in South Africa. It's a time when many loved ones gather outdoors for refreshing swims, summer meals and overall happiness. But it's also a period of heatwaves and discomfort, making it important to take extra precautions for our wellbeing. With the realities of climate change, these facts are aggravated. As a senior, rising temperatures require you to be even more intentional about your health during the summertime.

A 2021 Harvard University article shows that older adults are more vulnerable to heat related illness. "Studies show that it can be hard for even healthy older adults to tell when it's too hot or if they're dehydrated," it said. This may be linked to chronic health conditions and the propensity towards medications that lead to heat intolerance. So as the days grow longer and the nights grow shorter, remember to take care of yourself with the following tips in mind.

### Stay Hydrated

Even under more bearable conditions, we lose water through sweat and breathing. For senior adults, internal temperatures rise faster because the water is lost at a faster rate. Remember to drink plenty of water throughout the day to avoid dehydration, which can cause dizziness, confusion and fainting. If any of these symptoms arise, consult with your doctor as soon as you can, as they can be signs of other underlying medical conditions.

### Stay Cool

Whether you're at home or on holiday, remember to take frequent breaks indoors or in the shade. Stay cool by retreating from direct sunlight and drinking cold, electrolyte-filled beverages.

### Rest

Heat exhaustion can often present itself as dizziness, nausea, discoordination or physical weakness. Since heat exhaustion is not always immediately noticeable, it is essential that you take breaks and remember to take refuge in the shade while staying hydrated. Seniors may not notice their body temperatures rising as easily as younger adults do, so wear a hat, stay in the shade and drink plenty of cool water.

### Skincare

Sun protection is important for everybody but, as you grow older, it becomes more critical. Extreme or long exposure to the sun can cause skin conditions like blisters, dryness, redness, peeling and tenderness. Stay out of direct sunlight as much as you can, wear protective clothing and use a broad-spectrum sunscreen (SPF 30 or higher) to prevent sunburn. Take extra care of your skin by moisturising any affected areas and, if you do experience sunburn, take cooler showers, and stay out of the sun.

# QUESTION COLUMN

## **What happens to my pension if I pass away and my children are over 21?**

If a pensioner passes away and leaves behind a spouse and biological children who are below the age of 21, the family has to notify the fund and the spouse must complete a form 2 document for themselves and the minor children in order for the Fund to start paying them a monthly pension.

If a pensioner passes away and there is no spouse and minor children, their pension ceases. There is a R3000 minimum benefit payable to the estate late account.

NB: the R3000 minimum benefit does not apply to deferred pensioners.

**I would like to know what I must submit. I'm getting divorced and the agreement is that 50% of my pension should be paid out to my spouse. Please advise what documentation I should submit to you.**

Once the divorce is finalised, the court will issue a divorce order and a settlement which should be sent

to the fund's legal department to confirm whether the order is binding to the fund, should the divorce order be binding to the Fund, the Ex spouse will be notified and sent a claim form to complete to enable the fund to process the claim.

**I would like to know if I can make a partial withdrawal from my Pension fund to settle a debt. If yes, what is the procedure to initiate the process?**

At present, the rules of the fund do not allow for anyone who is still in the employ of Eskom to withdraw from their pension. benefits are payable when you resign, retire or upon death to your beneficiaries.

**How can I quickly view my benefit statement without having to email/call the EPPF?**

you can register on our member portal on the EPPF website or you can also download the EPPF app on the Google App store on your phone, register and that will give you quick access to your statement and more

# POPIA Notice

## *Protection of Personal Information Act*

In 2013, certain sections of the POPIA came into effect. The POPIA seeks to regulate the processing of personal information by responsible parties, in this case, the Fund. The purpose of the POPIA is to ensure that all South African institutions conduct themselves in a responsible manner when they are in possession of another entity or person's personal information. This includes prohibiting the sharing of a member's personal information with third parties without the consent of the member. The Fund complies with the POPIA to ensure that our members' information is

secure and protected. Therefore, the EPPF does not provide pension information to third parties (e.g; financial advisers) unless authorised by the member or compelled to do so by law.

POPIA came into effect on 1 July 2020, As an organisation which places its members, and the safeguarding of their personal information high on our priorities list, we embarked on a journey towards POPIA compliance some time ago. The remaining provisions of POPIA came into effect on 1 July 2021.
